- What are the main innovation taking place in this context, in an interdisciplinary perspective from ICT innovation to social and urban innovation?
- To what extent are these different developments able to impact on the problems of the ageing society? What is potential of innovation of such experiences and perspectives?
- What are the societal and ethical problems rising from the increased role played by technology in the ageing society, considering the main dilemmas connected to the end-of-life?
