In recent years around the Mediterranean Sea, migration processes –within other global movements– have given renewed strength to the debate on arrival in migration and urban studies.

The territorial dimension of arrival and its

challenges make it a crucial matter for urban policies and planning. Many agree on the need to start from the spaces where arrival takes place to understand this phenomenon. Indeed, spaces are where arrival is performed, and its complexities become more visible, where the territory changes and different interventions can be put in place. However, the conceptualizations of arrival and definitions of arrival spaces open some crucial questions on this topic's relationship with planning: which challenges do arrival set for public action, urban policies, and planning?
