



History

The **Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (Dipartimento di Architettura e Studi Urbani – DASTU)** is a thematic and interdisciplinary research structure established in January 2013 at the Politecnico di Milano.

The Department deals with architectural and urban projects, spatial planning and territorial governance, urban policy, conservation and intervention on heritage and natural environment, historical and critical interpretation of architecture, city, and territory.

It carries out research and fieldwork on transformation, care and government of historical and contemporary settlements and landscapes, significantly contributing to education and training of architects and urban planners at Politecnico di Milano.

Directed by Prof. Massimo Bricocoli, DASTU, with its **169 Faculty Members**, is the second-largest Department at Politecnico di Milano. It is one of Italy's most important research structures for urban and regional planning, embedded in a well-established international network of centres of excellence. It is open to different forms of cooperation with institutional and social actors at the local, national, and international levels.

DASTU is based on a cultural collaboration, centered on developing and innovating the Politecnico di Milano tradition. DASTU aims at establishing a department structure where the various disciplines dealing with territorial projects could meet and create a forum for interdisciplinary dialogue. It explores new contact points, in the evolution of disciplinary areas, between environment, community, and architectural designers and between design, communication, policy, and management experts.

DASTU is one of the 180 Italian departments selected and financed by the Italian Ministry of University and Research (MIUR), within the initiative "Dipartimenti di Eccellenza" (L. 232/2016), an innovative grant for the departments which stand out for the quality of the research.

In this frame, DASTU will explore the process of fragilization of the relation between space and society, in the interplay of environmental, social, economic, political, and institutional related issues.

Research

DASTU is currently one of Italy's largest departmental research centres, structured in four internal sections, which combine different scientific disciplinary sectors:

- **Architectural Design**
- **Urban Planning and Design**
- **History, Preservation, and Representation**
- **Humanities, Social Sciences, and Sustainable Architecture Design**

It is active in many fields of research and consultancy and, thanks to its multidisciplinary approach, it offers expertise, and it delivers projects to multiple subjects and organizations, such as European, national, regional and local authorities, social and economic groups, and research institutions.

Different sources of funding support the research activity: the Italian Ministry for Education (MIUR), the National Research Council and the European Commission, and other public administrations, non-profit organizations and private entities.

There are a lot of Research laboratories and **Departmental laboratories**: "Climate Change, Risk and Resilience", "Building Analysis and Diagnostic", "Mapping and Urban Data Lab", and "Techniques for the Conservation and Management of Architectural Heritage".





Post-Graduate Education

DASStU provides a major contribution in the **School of Architecture and Society** teaching activities, in all its undergraduate and graduate programmes in Architecture, Environmental architecture, Planning, Building techniques, and in some undergraduate and graduate programmes in other Schools of Architecture and Engineering. At a time of continuous cultural, social and economic change, DASStU can tackle new challenges and societal demand. DASStU offers a wide range of post-graduate courses, including Doctoral Programs, Specializing Masters, Professional Training Courses, Short Courses, and the only Italian **Specialist School in "Architectural and Landscape Heritage"**, directed by prof. Alberto Grimoldi.

Since 1988 DASStU has been contributing to spurring debate on planning, urban design, geography, and social disciplines themes through the publication of the quarterly journal **Territorio**.

The Editor is the Head of the Department. The journal has an Editorial Board and an International Scientific Board; it normally hosts articles in Italian, but also in English and in French. It is indexed on Scopus and other databases.
