



History

The **Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (Dipartimento di Architettura e Studi Urbani – DASTU)** is a thematic and interdisciplinary research structure established in January 2013 at the Politecnico di Milano.

The Department deals with architectural and urban projects, spatial planning and territorial governance, urban policy, conservation and intervention on heritage and natural environment, and historical and critical interpretation of architecture, city, and territory.

It makes research and fieldwork on the transformation, care and government of historical and contemporary settlements and landscapes. It also contributes to the education and training of architects and urban planners at Politecnico di Milano.

Directed by Prof. Massimo Bricocoli, DASTU, with its **192 Faculty Members**, is the second-largest Department at Politecnico di Milano. It is one of Italy's most important urban and regional planning research structures, embedded in a well-established international network of centres of excellence. It is open to cooperation with institutional and social actors at the local, national, and international levels.

DASTU is based on a cultural collaboration centred on developing and innovating the Politecnico di Milano tradition. DASTU aims to establish a department structure where the various disciplines dealing with territorial projects could meet and create a forum for interdisciplinary dialogue. It explores new contact points, in the evolution of disciplinary areas, between environment, community, and architectural designers and between design, communication, policy, and management experts.

From 2018 to 2022 and from 2023 to 2027, DASTU has been selected and financed by the Italian Ministry of University and Research (MUR), within the initiative "Dipartimenti di Eccellenza" (L. 232/2016). This grant is given to the departments which stand out for the quality of the research.

In this frame, from 2018 to 2022, DASTU explored the fragilization of the relation between space and society in the interplay of environmental, social, economic, political, and institutional issues.

Research

DASTU is currently one of Italy's largest departmental research centres, structured in four internal sections, which combine different scientific disciplinary sectors:

- **Architectural Design**
- **Urban Planning and Design**
- **History, Preservation, and Representation**
- **Humanities, Social Sciences, and Sustainable Architecture Design**

It is active in many fields of research and consultancy. Thanks to its multidisciplinary approach, it offers expertise. It delivers projects to multiple subjects and organizations, such as European, national, regional and local authorities, social and economic groups, and research institutions.

Different funding sources support the research activity: the Italian Ministry for Education (MIUR), the National Research Council and the European Commission, and other public administrations, non-profit organizations and private entities.

There are a lot of Research laboratories and **Departmental laboratories**: "Climate Change, Risk and Resilience", "Building Analysis and Diagnostic", "Mapping and Urban Data Lab", and "Techniques for the Conservation and Management of Architectural Heritage".





Post-Graduate Education

DASStU provides a significant contribution in the **School of Architecture and Society** teaching activities, in all its undergraduate and graduate programmes in Architecture, Environmental Architecture, Planning, and Building techniques, and in some undergraduate and graduate programmes in other Schools of Architecture and Engineering. DASStU offers a wide range of post-graduate courses, including Doctoral Programs, Specializing Masters, Professional Training Courses, Short Courses, and the only Italian **Specialist School in "Architectural and Landscape Heritage"**, directed by prof. Alberto Grimoldi.

The Department contributes to lifelong learning programs for professionals, organizing courses in the field of: Real Estate Finance, Technical Property Consulting, Geographic Information Systems (GIS), Governance, Climate Change and Territorial Risks, Design Computer Drawing, Architectural and Landscape Heritage, Urban Planning, International Cooperation, Interior Design, Transport Policies, Public Procurement, Building Information Modeling (BIM).

Since 1988 DASStU has contributed to spurring debate on planning, urban design, geography, and social disciplines through the quarterly journal **Territorio**.

The Editor is the Head of the Department. The journal has an Editorial Board and an International Scientific Board; it usually hosts articles in Italian, English, and French. It is indexed on Scopus and other databases.

Every year the Department promotes an intense programme of national and international Seminars approved by the Department Council.
