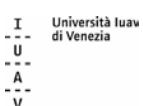
MANUFACTURING HERITAGE AND AUTHENTICITY IN NAPLES'S PIAZZA GARIBALDI

In recent years, the multimodal station and square of Piazza Garibaldi in Naples underwent great transformations. The project designed by Dominique Perrault Architecture defined different spaces in relation to the Napoli Centrale square and its surroundings. Drawing on ethnographic accounts of socio-material controversies involving the "authenticity" of market activities and spaces, this seminar will shed light on the influence and mediation of heritage-related elements.
